



Osman breaks the fantasy by stomping on the city and the game is ruined:

I run after him.

Hit Osman.

Hard.

He begins to cry.

I'm crying too.

But no one wants to say sorry.

The children build a city but above all a friendship, learning the art of saying sorry and becoming friends again after a fight.

Emilia Ilke (b. 1984) is an artist and stylist. She was educated at Gerlesborgs School. *Count With the Sea* is her first children's book.








Pony's Tail



They All Saw It is a suspenseful book of whimsical photographs and artfully designed text. A young reader flips through photos of various animals that have reacted to something they have seen, animals alive with attitudes and expressions, jumping, hesitating, wondering, bellowing. For they all saw it (except the polar bear who was asleep). But the reader only discovers at the end what it was...


They All Saw It represents a selection of Austrian-born photographer Ylla's best studies, taken over a period of eleven years. The book was first published in 1944 in the United States as the first of four books created in collaboration with Margaret Wise Brown. With a desire to better identify with wild animals, see the world through their eyes and explore their thoughts and feelings, Ylla embarked on a series for children, photographing animal adventures with a storyline. This endeavor introduced a whole new world of animal photography.



Finally, Esther and the kangaroo end up in the toy section on the top floor. They decide to sit down and wait for their dads, since that's what you're supposed to do when you get lost. Then they hear someone growling, and all the stuffed animals in the toy section squeak with fright. The CROCO-DILE is coming!

Fortunately, Esther and the kangaroo are both used to adventure. But what will happen to their poor lost parents?



We Go to the Park is a picture book for children and adults of all ages – about play, childhood, and the universal question of where we come from. Some say that we come from stars, that we're made of stardust, that once we swirled into the world from nowhere. We don't know. So we go to the park.

A one-of-a-kind project that can be read on many levels – boldly designed with raw edges and a special binding. Some pages are just illustrated, on others the text gets all the space for itself.

Sara Stridsberg is one of Sweden's most acclaimed authors and playwrights, translated into 25 languages. She has received The European Prize for Literature and been shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize for *The Faculty of Dreams*, for which she was also awarded the Nordic Council Literature Prize. She was a member of the Swedish Academy from 2016 to 2018.

Beatrice Alemagna's picture books have been published and exhibited around the world. Her long list of international recognitions includes the Premio Andersen Award, a Bologna Ragazzi Mention, the Society of Illustrator's Gold Medal for Original Art, five White Ravens Awards and three Baobab Prizes for the most innovative books for children.

In *The Expedition*, a small group of bold and curious explorers embark on a journey towards a world filled with obscure mysteries and beautiful landscapes. They step on the gangplank and wave goodbye, then they are immersed by an odd darkness. Our protagonist Tusseson documents everything that happens in his logbook.

The daring inner journey is led by transparent guides who take the expedition crew deeper and deeper into the unknown. They travel by boat across the Stomach's Stormy Sea, paddle through the Small Intestine's Emerald Green Canals, camp at the Lungs (despite all the wind!), climb the Muscle Mountains, are captivated by the roar of the Heart's Deep Caves, escape through the Nerve Forest and marvel at the night sky, Iris, reflected in the Pacific Tear Channel.

At the end of the journey, it's only Tusseson left, the others have all returned home for various reasons: broken bones, fever, homesickness... But Tusseson won't give up until he finds the Mysterious Meadows of the Brain.



Barbro Lindgren (1937) is one of Sweden's most acclaimed writers of children's books. For her lasting contribution as a children's book author, Barbro Lindgren was a finalist for the Hans Christian Andersen Award in 2004. In 2014, she won the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award (ALMA).

Anna Höglund (1958) is considered one of Sweden's foremost illustrators. She has been awarded with both Swedish and foreign literary awards, including the Elsa Beskow Plaque, Deutscher Jugendliteraturpreis, Zilveren penseel, the August Prize and the Nils Holgersson Plaque.


Thumbelina sleeps bed Comes the toad Toad bad

Children's book giants Barbro Lindgren and Anna Höglund are back with a new condensed version of a literary classic, H C Andersen's *Thumbelina*.

Also in this version, Thumbelina is confronted with marriage-obsessed toads, moles, and maybugs, who she successfully escapes to finally fall in love with a prince her own size. Yet *Look Thumbelina* feels like something new, thanks to the congenial combination of laconic text and expressive illustrations in pencil and watercolor, in which our strong yet vulnerable heroine has a bold fuchsia hairdo and an array of facial expressions that make this short story more nuanced than what it first appears.



Jane, the Fox and Me

Hélène has been inexplicably ostracized by the girls who were once her friends. Her loving mother is too tired to be any help. Fortunately, Hélène has one consolation, Charlotte Brontë's Jane Eyre. Hélène identifies strongly with Jane's tribulations, and when she is lost in the pages of this wonderful book, she is able to ignore her tormentors. But when Hélène is humiliated on a class trip in front of her entire grade, she needs more than a fictional character to see herself as a person deserving of laughter and friendship.

This emotionally honest and visually stunning graphic novel reveals the casual brutality of which young people are capable, but also assures readers that redemption can be found through connecting with another, whether the other is a friend, a fictional character or even, amazingly, a fox.

But Noah doesn't want to go; the whole class will be there, and he never plays with Alma. "I'm sure it'll be super fun," Mom says, and then they hurry across town to look for a gift. They rush hither and thither between stores. When they find a present at last, Noah realizes he's forgot his jacket somewhere (it's back at the clothing store). Then Noah's cap also disappears (they find it in the toy store)! And when the party is about to start, the present itself is gone, too!

Before the dizzying "forgetting day" is over, something happens that gets Noah and his mother to discover who is the worst forgetter of all (hint: it isn't Noah)!

With Forgetting Day, Sara Lundberg has written and illustrated a story of everyday life bursting with color and filled with both humor and sharp observation.





Educated at McDaniel College, USA, and at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Stockholm, **Sara Lundberg** is acknowledged both as an illustrator and as a writer of children's books. She has been nominated to The Nordic Council Literature Award for her works, as well as for the British Kate Greenaway Medal. Sara Lundberg has won the August Prize several times, in 2017 for her critically acclaimed *The Bird Within Me Flies Wherever It Wants*.


We Are Running!



A Summer of Diving is a vibrant story about a parent's lost joy of living and a child's longing for closeness, but also about the power of dream and imagination. Despite the dark theme, the story is full of humor and lightness.




Our identities aren't defined by two words alone — even less by those two words in the title of this book.

Stockholm, 1880. It's a merciless winter and the entrances to the inner city are blocked by the snow. It's impossible to get in or out.

Eleven-year-old Mika is an orphan and has lived at the orphanage her whole life. She helps take care of the younger children at the orphanage and works extra in a crummy pub. To survive, Mika has developed a keen sense of detail and knows how to recognize threatening situations.

Late one night at the pub, she listens in on a conversation between two policemen. There's been a murder, and its circumstances resemble the way the Night Raven used to operate. The Night Raven was an infamous killer that terrorized the city a few years before. Against her will, Mika is drawn into the investigation.

While working together to solve the case, Mika and police constable Valdemar Hoff develop an odd friendship. Powerful people in the city are hiding something, and Mika must put all her skills to the test to solve the mystery and save them both.




