

Ivar's task is to guard the empty room when mom and dad are at work. It's a big room, with plenty of space for just about anything. That's why so many people want to buy the empty room. Every day there are new prospective buyers. A baker wants to build a rollercoaster bakery, a mailman dreams of a love letter factory, a tourist guide wants to create a monster hotel, a sleep researcher wants a forest for sleeping in... The dreams are breathtaking, and each buyer offers more than the last. A thousand coins! A hundred thousand! A million! A billion! But one day, two buyers who are unlike the others show up...

A fantastical, clever picture book adventure written with great linguistic delight and subtle humor, and vibrant and whimsical illustrations.



#### The Pine Needle Child

On a windy fall morning, there is a knock at the door, and a lone pine needle child with twiggy legs steps into the cottage. She sheds needles like an old Christmas tree, and Micky, Britten, and Jones ask if she is hungry. She licks the jam off a sandwich and climbs in the doll bed. Then she sits there, shedding needles. Micky combs her with a scrub brush. They sweep and shovel all the time, but still prick their paws. There are needles everywhere! Finally, Jones has had enough and shouts that he hates everything that pricks. The next morning, the pine needle child is gone.

Klara Bartilsson's first solo picture book, *The Pine Needle Child*, is a playful and uniquely prickly picture book drama that hits right in the heart. The text and illustrations are quirky, atmospheric, and warmly humorous.

**Klara Bartilsson** is an illustrator, visual artist, and pattern designer educated at HDK in Gothenburg. The picture book *Mom Is in Trouble* (2023), written by Daniel Sjölin, was recently awarded the Spårhunden prize for the year's best children's and young adult crime fiction.








#### Thud, Splash, Pop!



In *The Expedition*, a small group of bold and curious explorers embark on a journey in a world full of obscure mysteries and beautiful landscapes. The motley expedition crew adventures deeper and deeper into the unknown. They travel by boat across the Stomach's Stormy Sea, camp at the Lungs (despite all the wind!), climb the Muscle Mountains, are captivated by the roar of the Heart's Deep Caves, escape through the Nerve Forest and marvel at the night sky, Iris, reflected in the Pacific Tear Channel.

Our protagonist Tusseson documents everything that happens in his logbook, and he is also the only one left at the end of the journey; the others have all returned home for various reasons: broken bones, fever, homesickness... But Tusseson won't give up until he finds the Mysterious Meadows of the Brain.





Last winter was fun. Little and big wolf got to play hide and seek in the park and the air was full of ice crystals. With little wolf anything could happen. But now she is gone, and it is dark in all the windows. Big wolf is alone and waiting. Maybe little wolf is just hiding somewhere, like before? Behind one of the trees or down by the lake? Big wolf counts to a thousand and turns around. "Here I come!" she shouts into the darkness.


Sara Stridsberg has written a touching story about grief and longing, and about the memory of the one who recently made the world sparkle. Sara Lundberg has illustrated the wolf cubs' play with coarse oil pastels and captured every breath in the cold winter. The duo's previous The Summer of Diving was nominated for the August Prize. A picture book "that shines with poetically precise words and images," wrote the jury.

Sara Stridsberg is one of Sweden's foremost novelists and playwrights. Little Wolf is her fourth children's book. During 2024, she is also releasing a novel and two newly written plays.

Sara Lundberg, author and artist, is one of Sweden's most praised picture book creators. She has been nominated for the August Prize several times and most recently won in 2017 for The Bird Within Me Flies Wherever It Wants. Sara Lundberg is also nominated for the ALMA Prize.

#### The Book of Perception

Lucie Lučanská

This book takes us on a sensory journey of discovery. A separate chapter is dedicated to each of our five senses and, although each differs from the others in its artistic and printing techniques, the overall result retains consistency and balance. A less mainstream, more alternative illustration style creates a melancholic and subtle feel throughout.

This book aims to encourage children to focus on individual sensory perceptions and to investigate things thoroughly and in depth. On a walk through the forest, they learn that colour can change depending on the light, that dogs can detect smells better than humans, and that fallen apples can be sweet while pears hanging from trees can be sour.

Readers can not only explore the sensory world in words, however, but with their fingers too. That's true not only of the linen cover but also of the chapter on touch. Here, a special varnish was used in the printing that invites the reader to feel the illustrations. Even smell can be experienced in this book. In the relevant chapter, rubbing one of the illustrations brings forth a forest scent. Three different types of paper and spot colours complement the different sensory impressions, making the book a special tactile and visual experience – and not just for children.








#### **Leontine's Big Ears**

Editor, director and screenwriter Alice Rohrwacher was born in Fiesole in 1981 and grew up in Umbria. She studied Literature and Philosophy and specialized in screenwriting, dramaturgy, narrative techniques and documentaries. She made her debut as a director in 2006 and in 2023, she received an Oscar nomination for the short film Le pupille.

Maurizio A.C. Quarello is a giant of illustration, capable of making each book different in style from the previous one. His books are translated all over the world and he has won countless awards. Today his time is divided between the drawing board and the professorship at the Academy of Fine Arts in Turin.
